

boundary line to the north angle of the said Township, thence south-easterly along the rear or north-east boundary lines of said Township of Frampton, and of the Townships of Cranbourne and Watford, to the easterly angle of Watford, and from thence on the same course, to the southern boundary of the Province; and shall comprehend all the Islands in the said River St. Lawrence, nearest to the said County, and in the whole or in part fronting the same. The County of Dorchester shall be bounded on the north-east by the south-west boundary line of the County of Hertford; on the south-west by the north-east boundary lines of the Seigniories of St. Antoine, Gaspé and St. Giles, running from the St. Lawrence, south-east along the Seignior of St. Antoine, to its depth, and thence along Gaspé and St. Giles on the same course to the north north-west boundary line of the Seignior of Ste. Marie, then south-west along said boundary line to the most westerly angle of said last mentioned Seignior, then south easterly along the north-east boundary line of the said Seignior of St. Giles to the depth thereof, then south easterly along the north-east boundary lines of the Townships of Broughton, Tring, and Shienly, to the southerly angle of the Seignior of Aubert Gallion, on the line dividing the 4th and 5th ranges of the Township of Shienly, thence along the south-east boundary line of the said Seignior of Aubert Gallion, north-easterly to the River Chaudière, thence up to the middle of said River southerly to the line herein-after mentioned dividing the Districts of Quebec and Three-Rivers, thence along said District line to the southern boundary of the Province, and shall comprehend all the Islands in the said River St. Lawrence, nearest to the said County, and in the whole or in part fronting the same. The County of Buckinghamshire shall be bounded on the north-east, by the south-west boundary line of the County of Dorchester, on the south-west by the line herein-after mentioned, dividing the Districts of Montreal and Three-Rivers from the St. Lawrence to the southern boundary of the Province, and shall comprehend all the Islands in the said River St. Lawrence (or Lake St. Peter) nearest to the said County, and in whole or in part fronting the same. The County of Richelieu shall be bounded on the north-east by the south-west boundary line of the County of Buckinghamshire, beginning at the Bay Lavallière in rear of the tongue of land commonly called the Concession of the *Chenal du Moine*, at the line of division between the Seignior of Sorel and Yamaska, the said tongue of land being hereby included in the said County of Richelieu, being the line herein-after mentioned, dividing the Districts of Montreal and Three-Rivers; on the south-west
