After he had made the survey he drafted a report and certificate, which I typed for him, after which he had the rest of the day to himself which he spent in my company, and we had a good many drinks of Gin tegether.

Wallace & I have been very good friends ever since I arrived in Vancouver, in fact I knew him before, but not intimately, as I interviewed him at his house teld him just what I was up against.

He said hand steering gear why I saw that when I was MM at Ocean Falls. I said I know you did, but do you remember whether it was broken then. He said "was it"? I replied "Yes". Then he said alright, what else was broken, I showed him the petition. He read it took notes, came to the Court the following day and correborated everything I wanted him to do, it was really his testimony that carried the most weight."

There has been double crossing carried on all through my case I can put up many more glaring statements -- very many indeed.
