

IV. The one question that remains to be decided is how the documents are to be obtained by the Department. Should we make direct contact with the Secretary or other Executive official of the various Committees and Boards or is it intended that, particularly in the case of Press Releases, these documents should, in the first instance, be passed to the Prime Minister's Press liaison officer and from Mr. Turnbull forwarded to the Department of External Affairs.

V. It is understood that at the present time the various Boards are not only issuing their regulations independently but are also giving out Press Releases without having them pass through Mr. Turnbull's hands.

VI. An early decision as to the method to be employed in carrying out this policy will be appreciated.
