Dear Mr. White:-

In reply to your letter of 19th instant dealing with Indian Affairs in the Yukon, I have to say that we have made a certain progress in dealing with the Indians of this Territory. The Commissioner of the Yukon is giving the matter his personal attention and is making recommendations from time to time in connection with the service. I presume that he will still have to depend upon the officers of your Department for information and also for action. Your Department should certainly be reimbursed for any issue of medicines from your stores and I will be glad to receive a bill for any issues that have been made. The bill should be certified by your officer and come through Mr. Congdon's hands.

We have settled all the accounts for surgeons for the past fiscal year except one from Dr. George Madore which was returned for further detail, and one from Dr. W. E. Thompson, which was sent back for certificate.
