

Suppose Dr. Manion should not be equally lucky, and himself not returned? Is there any guarantee that anyone of them will honour his pledge to form a National Government, or to carry out a single promise that he has made.

In their own interests, electors will do well to take every possibility of a campaign into full account.

Dr. Manion will say Mr. King may not be elected.

There is, of course, such a possibility. I do not think it is a probability. But, supposing I were not elected. There are 15 gentlemen of outstanding ability by whom I have been surrounded in the Cabinet for years past. Everyone of them stands for the same policies as I do, are pledged to support and to carry them out, and would see to it that not a moment was lost in carrying on Canada's war effort in accordance with the wish to the electors as expressed at the polls. This is something of which it is well to take account at a time of war.
