had a great deal to do with research problems.

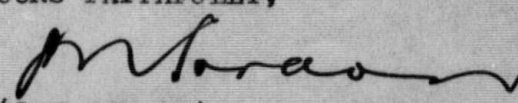
He is playing tennis every evening
