As requested in your letter of the 14th instant, we are enclosing copies of a sketch showing the location of the road on the Langley No. 6 Reserve. It is entirely within the Reserve and not the responsibility of the Provincial Public Works.

With reference to the purchase of farm equipment, the total acreage of this reserve is 447 acres. Approximately 45 acres are under cultivation, that is, in gardens, orchards and hay meadows. The hay crop is the main item for the dairy herds.

Over two thirds of the remaining acreage, approximately 300 acres, are available for extension of agricultural activities.

About ten Indians will make use of this tractor and equipment, and at our Band meeting the following Indians were appointed to be responsible and have charge of this equipment. The Acting Chief, Alfred Gabriel and George Fillardeau. This equipment will be housed in Fillardeau's old barn.

The Indians promised to bring all the available acreage under cultivation, and to become self sufficient with respect to feed for their dairy herds.
