IS THE BIBLE IN DANGER?

You ask me if I believe that the Bible is in danger, and, if not, why so much trouble about the action of the Professors in our Schools and Colleges.

I answer that there is no danger whatever as to the stability of the Word of God. When the granite peaks of Sinai, from which God spake to His servant Moses, and the earth and all the works therein, shall melt with fervent heat, there shall then be demonstrated the great truth “that the Word of God abideth forever.” But I have a fear that through the instruction of the present Professors, who are now forming the minds of the teachers in our Public Schools, our young men and women may be led astray, that their faith may be shaken in the Word of God, and that Agnostic and Infidel views may be propagated through a not unreasonable reliance on those who, “handling the Word of God deceitfully,” are by the authorities still retained in the position of instructors. All Christians sound in the faith should well consider the duty that is cast upon them to God, His Church, and the State, in these “perilous times.”

I have a great fear also that this teaching will most injuriously affect our congregations, and that the doubts,
