10.00 P.M.—Storming of St. Louis Gate by the Snowshoers.—Grand display of fireworks and illumination of the city.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 18th.

10.00 A.M.—Meeting of the Snowshoers on the Terrace.

11.00 A.M.—Church Parade of all the Snowshoe Clubs.

3.00 P.M.—Visiting various Snowshoe Club Houses of Quebec and Levis.—Winter Sports at the Kent House, Montmorency Falls.

8.00 P.M.—Smoking Concert and Distribution of Prizes to the winners of the winter sports.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 19th.

10.00 A.M.—War Dance by the Hurons, of Lorette, encamped at Place d'Armes.—Sugaring Party at the Camp on Dufferin Terrace.—Sliding at the Kent House and on Dufferin Terrace.—Military Exercises on snowshoes, by the Soldiers of the Garrison, at the Esplanade.

2.30 P.M.—Procession of tandems, automobiles, calèches, summer and winter vehicles, etc., through the principal streets of the city.

8.30 P.M.—Fancy Dress Ball at the Chateau Frontenac.

9.00 P.M.—Popular Masquerade Ball at the Drill Hall.—Also at the Auditorium Café, the latter under the auspices of the "Montagnais Snowshoe Club".

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 20th.

(Mardi Gras).

10.00 A.M.—Procession of Allegorical Cars and Decorative Floats through the principal streets of Quebec, including 30 cars of the Winter Circus.

2.30 P.M.—Grand Winter Circus at the Drill Hall.

7.30 P.M.—Last performance of the Winter Circus at the Drill Hall.

10.00 P.M.—Sham Battle between the Snowshoers and the Soldiers of the Garrison.—Spectacular attack on St. Louis Gate and capture of the Mardi Gras.—Grand display of fireworks.—Burning of the Mardi Gras, in effigy, on the city walls at the St. Louis Gate.—Brilliant illumination of the entire city.

Midnight.—Tolling of bells in token of the passing of the Mardi Gras.
