DEATHS.

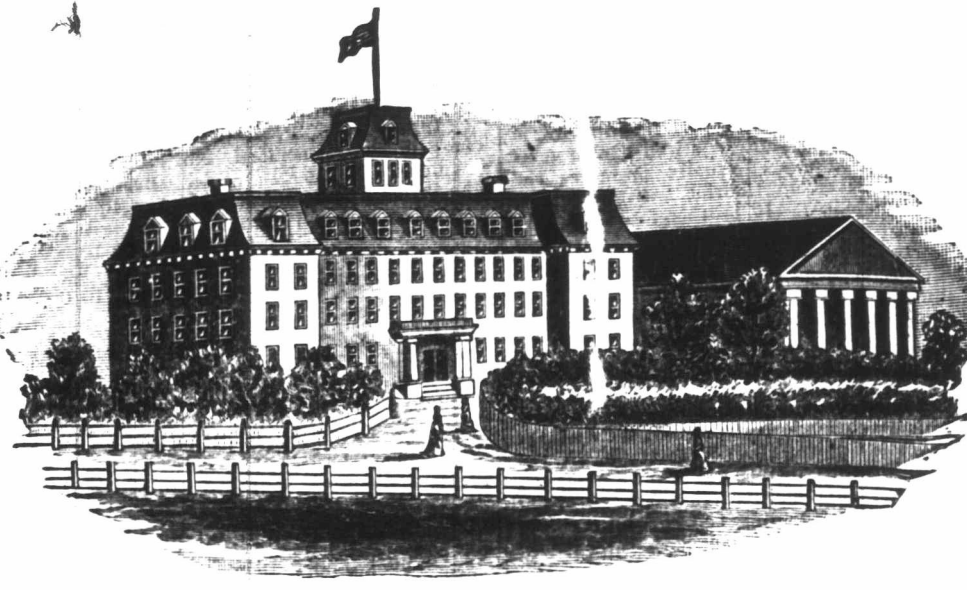

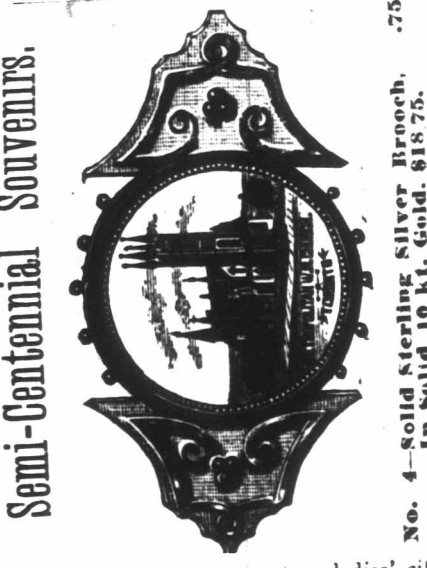

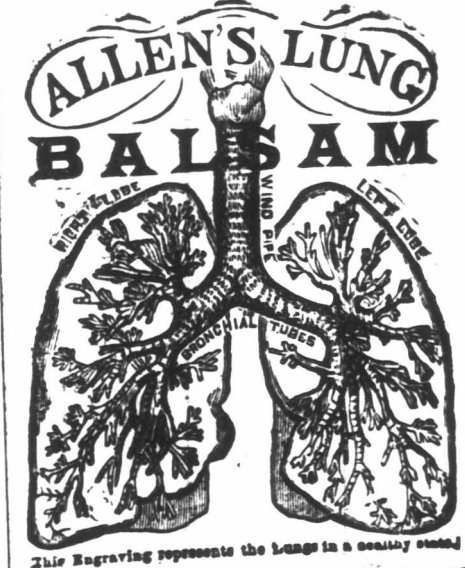
