

Mr. *Cuvillier* moved, seconded by Mr. *Dénéchau*, that a Call of this House be made on the twenty-fifth of February next.

Mr. *Vanfelson* then moved, seconded by Mr. *Mayrand*, that the House do adjourn.

And it being carried in the affirmative,

The House adjourned accordingly.

A PETITION of divers Inhabitants of the Parish of *Cap Saint Ignace*, County of *Devon*, whose names are thereunto subscribed, was presented to the House by Mr. *Fournier*, and the same was received and read ;—SETTING FORTH :—That last year, in the month of September, at the said Parish of *Cap Saint Ignace*, there occurred an extraordinary frost, which totally destroyed all the grain then growing, which has occasioned an extreme scarcity in the said Parish of *Cap Saint Ignace* ; that the poor and needy persons herein after named, do not possess any Seed Wheat wherewith to sow the ground next Spring, and that the persons herein after named indispensibly require the quantities herein after set opposite their respective names, that is to say :—[Here follow names and quantities.]—Wherefore the Petitioners apply with confidence to the House, and venture to flatter themselves, that the case of the aforesaid poor and needy persons, will be viewed with a favourable eye, and that it will please them to order that there be sent to the said Parish, in the ensuing Spring, gratuitously, Seed Wheat in the quantities herein before specified ; for unless the House gratuitously make provision of Seed Grain, as above prayed, for the needy persons before mentioned, whose state of distress
