The Petition from the Overfeers of the Poor at Truto, with the Accounts annexed, being confidered by the House, the same was dismissed

A Petition from David Seabury and others respecting a Road leading from the Annapolis road to the Chester Road, was presented, read and ordered to lie on the table.

On Motion ordered, That the Solicitor General Mr. Aplin and Mr. Wilkins, be a Committee to wait on his Excellency the Governor to request, he would be pleased to appoint one fit Person, and no more to attend the Poor House as a Surgeon and dispensing Physician.

A Message was sent to the Secretary of the Province to acquaint him, the House will be ready to attend His Excellency the Governor at the Council Chamber on Monday next.

The House having gonethrough the Estimate for the Year 1787, it was thereupon ordered, that the draft of a Bill should be prepared and brought in conformable thereto.

Then House adjourned to Eleven o'Clock on Monday.

A Message was received from the Council requesting, that the Flouse would allow to John Newton, Esqr; Collector of the Duties of Impost and Excise for the District of Halifax the Sum of One Hundred Pounds for his extra Services in that Office, but the House conceiving they had made sufficient Provision for such Service in this Session therefore cannot agreeto the Requisition made.

Capt. Howe moved, That a Committee be appointed to bring in the Heads of a Bill at the next Session for the Purpole of obtaining Credit on landed Security, for promoting Agriculture, and affifting the Farmer in his Exertions, which being seconded, and put, passed in the Affimative, and Mr. Aplin, Capt. Howe and Mr. Dight appointed accordingly.
