FISH FOR CANADIAN TROOPS

Ottawa, Feb. 9.—The first big consignment of Canadian fish for Canadian soldiers now overseas is being dispatched to England. About forty tons of lake and sea fish will be sent weekly henceforth. The first lot is made up of salmon and halibut from the Pacific coast, and cod, sole, smoked haddock, and filets, from the Maritime Provinces. Later shipments will contain white fish from western lakes, and herrings from Lake Superior.

ESTIMATES FOR 1916

Ottawa, Feb. 4.—Sir Thomas White, minister of finance, in the commons yesterday afternoon tabled the main estimates for the fiscal year, which commences with the coming April. They provide for a total expenditure of \$1,895,054,110; the total estimates for the current fiscal year which closes on March 31 were for the sum of \$1,968,517,728. There is therefore a decrease of \$73,463,618, apart of course from any supplementary estimates which may be brought down before the end of the session. It is not expected, however, that these will be large.
