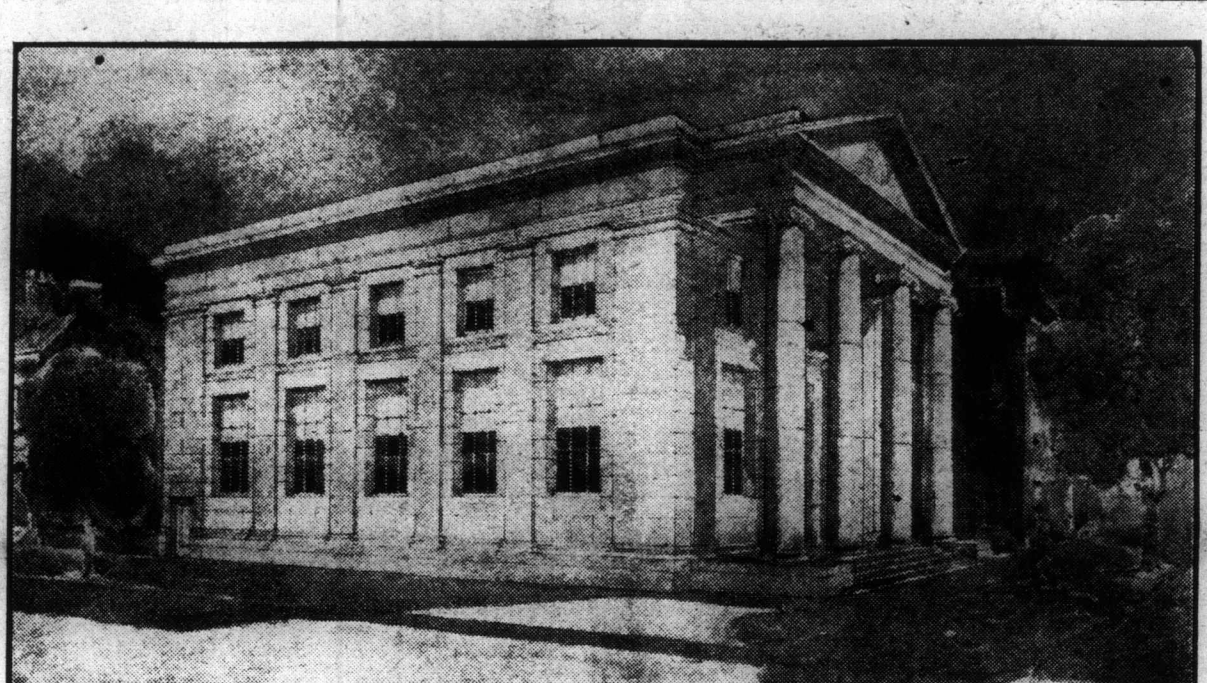
The Lake Erie & Northern route at the point where their bridge crosses the Grand River, near the T. H. & B. structure, will go over the old Grand River bed property.

RECOVERS BODY NEAR LAKEVIEW

One of the Boys Was Washed Into the Whirlpool Below the Falls.

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., July 19.—The body of a boy found on Wednesday afternoon at Lakeview on the Ontario shore, about six miles from Oswego, is believed to be that of Donald Roscoe, 11 years old, who was drowned with Hubert Moore in the Whirlpool Rapids on June 22, when a boat in which they were playing broke from its moorings near the old Maid of the Mist landing and passed down the river.

Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Roscoe, the boy's parents, are convinced that the body was that of their son from the description of the clothing on it.

The father and Coroner Scott were notified last night of the finding of the body, but because it had been burned he did not go on to Oswego.

It is expected that the clothes will be shipped here for examination.

The place where the body was found is about 160 miles from the point where the body was drowned.

LORD CECIL ON THE SCANDAL

NEW YORK, July 19.—A London cable says: "I do not wish, and I do not believe any other Unionist member has the slightest wish to drive the Attorney-General and the Chancellor of the Exchequer from public life," said Lord Robert Cecil at Hinchin last night, but he added:

"We did say, and I say now, that it was the duty of the House of Commons to say that the transactions in American Marconi were improper and if the result was that the Ministers felt bound to resign their offices—well I do not myself think it would be an unduly heavy punishment for the offence they had committed."

FRAZER ESTATE REACHES \$80,000

And Mrs. Frazer Gets it All--Famous Case Will be Rushed to Conclusion.

MIDLAND, Ont., July 19.—The will of the late Michael Frazer, the octogenarian who figured in a sensational marriage with Miss Hannah Robertson of Dundas, will be filed for probate in a few days. The papers in the case are all prepared and the value will show the estate to be worth between \$60,000 and \$80,000.

The will of John Frazer was in process of probate when Michael Frazer married, Margaret McCormick, a second cousin, began an action to have the old man declared insane and in view of this fact the probate of John Frazer's will was deferred until the settlement of the action which is still dragging along in the courts.

The estate of John Frazer consisted of \$22,000, town property and mortgages, representing several millions. This will is now in process of settlement and application will be made by Mr. Sidney Grant, representing Mrs. Frazer to have the matter cleared up in a few days. Law costs have absorbed some \$20,000 of the estate.

SAVED BY UNKNOWN AT BRINK OF FALLS

Hamilton Man Topples Over Rail and is Dragged in by Human Chain.

HERO WON'T TELL NAME

Victim of Fit Ledged on a Rock Fifteen Feet From Niagara's Edge.

NIAGARA FALLS, July 19.—Truman Chapman, 25 years old, of Hamilton, Ont., was rescued from the very brink of the American Falls last night by four men, one of whom took desperate chances to reach him.

Chapman was sitting on the iron railing just above Prospect Point about 9 o'clock, when the loiterers in the park were horrified to see him suddenly topple backwards and fall into the stream. At this point the current is swift and the pull toward the brink of the Falls almost irresistible.

After striking the water, Chapman's body lodged against two small projections of rock, and this undoubtedly saved him from almost instant death.

When the cry went up that a man was in the water, John Hughes and Thomas Swinders, of Niagara Falls, and Thomas D. Thomas, of Toronto, and a fourth man who did not give his name to the police leaped over the railing. The unidentified man waded out several feet from the shore, but could not reach far enough to get a secure hold of Chapman, who seemed to be unconscious or unable to help himself.

Hughes, Swinders and Thomas formed in a chain from the iron fence, and, clinging to the unknown's hand, enabled him to get a few inches nearer Chapman.

When the unconscious man was pulled away from the supporting hold of the rocks there was another moment of intense suspense for the rescuers. His body was a dead weight, and the pull of the current toward the brink of the falls, less than fifteen feet away, was tremendous. A break in the chain meant not only the loss of Chapman's life, but also that of
