SYNOPOPIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alber ta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in cacn of three years. A homesteader may live within land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Albertonine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is prformed in the vecentty.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing many pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence the each of three years, after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Preemption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain condi-

A settler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take a purchased home-stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction is case of rough, scrubby or stony land. 
