The function of the Red Cross is to assist, co-operate and co-ordinate health work. Its activities may be undertaken in co-operation with the Government and the Medical Profession. The policy is not one leading to interference with other already active organizations doing public health or relief work.

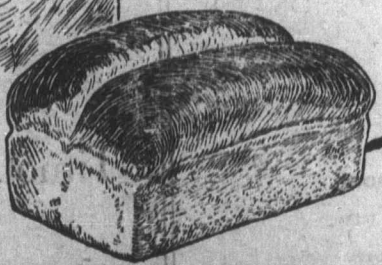
