RIPE STRAWBERRIES.—Section foreman D. Carter found ripe strawberries at Aulac on Wednesday. A little child of Mr. Amos Dixon's, Sackville, found a number of ripe berries on Monday day. Tantramar breezes tend to early ripening of fruit.

ESCAPED BEAR.—A bear belonging to Archie Madden, Macen N. S., escaped some days ago and savagely attacked another bear which had taken refuge at the top of a pole. Mr. Madden feared to approach his dangerous pet, and so was obliged to shoot the free one which was a very large and fine specimen of its kind. During the short time he was loose the bear caused considerable excitement in his immediate neighborhood.

R. T. or F. A. Council of the Royal Templars of Temperance was organized in Powell's Hall last Friday evening. SCHOOL MEETING.—The meeting in school district No. 11 held in the Town Hall, Middle Sackville, on Thursday afternoon was of more than ordinary interest on account of discussions which were expected concerning the recent burning of Central School house. About forty ratapayers were present. W. F. George was appointed chairman and I. C. Harper sec'y of meeting. In the absence of the auditor, Bertie E. Black was appointed to that position. The trustees and auditors reports were passed. Mr. Geo. Campbell the retiring trustee was re-elected, the vote standing: Geo. Campbell, 30; F. J. Yimble, 12; J. J. Anderson, 8; Bertie E. Black was elected auditor. The trustees report stated that four schools, two primary, two advanced, had been in operation with good attendance during the year. A somewhat heated discussion was held in regard to the burned schoolhouse and several motions were made and voted on. Finally \$600 were voted for current expenses for the coming year; \$75 to assist the insurance companies in holding an investigation into the cause of the fire. It was also determined to rebuild the burned building at once and the trustees were authorized to take all necessary precautions for the future, to adopt standard time and to sell the school lot near Crane's Corner.

FOOTBALL.—The second match of the N. B. Rugby League series was played on the College grounds at Sackville between Moncton and Sackville. Sunday afternoon last and resulted in a victory for the home team by a try 3 to 0. The game was in the hands of Mr. Allison from the start and not once was their goal in danger. The Moncton men, however, who looked liked giants beside their smaller opponents, played a fast and plucky game and though obliged to touch for safety several times prevented Mr. Allison from scoring again. The try was secured by Sheehan about the middle of the first half. Throughout the game the ball was kept well in Moncton territory and during the last half almost continuously within the Moncton twenty five yard line. The game was not so scientific as it might have been. Some free kicks were awarded to each side and more should have been. Both teams will improve during the season however. Moncton has a very heavy team and moreover a team which has evidently practiced hard this year. The Sackville team contains some of the best players who have played for several years but also many new men. The Sackville backs who easily bested their opponents on Saturday are not only comparatively new to the game but very light. During the next year or two they will increase in weight and improve in playing and great things are expected of them. In the early part of the game Capt. Sanford, Mr. Allison, was so seriously hurt as to render him practically useless, though he kept the field, and Mr. Allison was really playing fourteen men against fifteen. Mr. R. H. Graham of New Glasgow who led the Dalhousie team against Mt. Allison in the fall of '92 refereed in a satisfactory manner. The touch judges were Marr for Sackville and Torrie for Moncton. About two hundred spectators witnessed the game.

One of the great games of the series will be played to-morrow when St. John meets Sackville on the Sackville grounds. These teams have struggled for the mastery for years and every game has been well contested. No one who is interested in football can afford to miss this game.

BOOK NOTES.—The twenty-third annual report of the Halifax School for the Blind has just been received and is an interesting pamphlet. By legislative enactment education is free in this institution to the blind of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick while the legislatures of P. E. Island and Newfoundland make annual grants to the institution. The school has a splendid staff of teachers and is yearly increasing in efficiency. The register of the Halifax division of the census of 24 males and 13 females, of whom 24 were from N. S., 14 from N. B., 2 from P. E. Island, and 7 from Newfoundland. The register is a valuable work. The school sends four of its graduates to the University of Toronto.

CHURCH DEDICATION AT CADMAN'S CORNER.—The dedication of the Methodist Church at Cadman's Corner took place on Sunday 7th inst. Rev. John A. Clarke A. M. of Point de Bute officiated at the morning service and preached an excellent and appropriate sermon on the subject of "The Church." The church is built on a lot, donated by Mr. James Anderson, on the eastern side of the post road and adjoining the property of Ezra Allen Esq. It is a plain building erected mainly, has no tower or pinnacles. There are three windows of equal size of Gothic style on each side, two of smaller size in front, and one smaller still over the entrance to the porch which is by a large single door. From the porch into the audience room the entrance is by a medium sized door. The interior is wholly finished in wood and presents a very neat and substantial appearance. The platform which extends about two thirds the way across the east end of the room is covered with a tapestry carpet of neat design.

The inside wood work was done chiefly by Mr. Tremblay of Wells of Midgie, and the painting was done by the vision of Mr. Jas. Costin of Baie Verte. The lot is open to the road but otherwise was surrounded by a high board fence affording shelter for teams.

DORCHESTER.—At the school meeting last Thursday M. G. Teed was chairman. Walter Dobson retiring trustee was re-elected and A. W. Chapman was elected auditor for the coming year. \$1125 were voted for school purposes and the trustees were authorized to borrow \$600 to provide a room in or annex to the present building for another department. The school at Penitentiary Row will be closed and the four departments brought under one roof and the school thoroughly graded.

BRIG "HELEN E. MITCHELL" is loading sleepers at the wharf for Bay Ridge N. Y. Ship "Hattie C" arrived here yesterday. She had been in collision with the steamer "Pottsville" at Dutch Island Harbor on 11th inst.
