The Horrors of the Plague.

AN ORIENTAL TRAVELLER'S EXPERIENCE IN CHOLERA INFESTED INDIA.

Shortly after the news of the outbreak of cholera in the south of France reached this country, a Chicago News reporter met a journeyman of the city who has spent eight years in eastern countries, and asked him whether he ever happened to have experience in the midst of the cholera epidemics that are understood to sweep over portions of Hindoostan periodically with great violence.

"Yes," was the reply, "I have some vivid recollections of the ravages of cholera in India. Sit down and I will tell you some of them. As you are probably aware, India is the natural home of the malady. It is always making its appearance there suddenly, and is usually or sporadically, sometimes in the large cities like Bombay, Calcutta, Madras, Ahmedabad, Allahabad, Delhi, Agra or Lahore, and sometimes in the most remote or country districts. Knowing its terrible and mysterious modes of travelling, it is unaccountably watched by the special health officers employed by the government of India and the governments of the different presidencies and provinces. It frequently, however, baffles every precaution to confine it, and I believe that every great epidemic of cholera in India has spread its ravages in Europe, Africa or America could be traced originally to some outbreak of the disease in India. When the British troops went to Egypt, after the suppression of Arabi Pasha's rebellion, you will remember the frightful scenes which were witnessed in Alexandria, Cairo, Port Said, and throughout the delta of the Nile. The English authorities tried to make it appear that this outbreak of cholera was merely a local epidemic, but the reports showed that it commenced after the death in Egyptian waters of several persons who had arrived from Bombay. As cholera is a seaport which does a considerable trade with the east, it is highly probable that the disease was brought from that part of the world, and I am more confirmed in this belief by the fact that only so far back as the middle of last April cholera appeared in Calcutta reported that cholera had suddenly burst out there with so much violence that the European residents, and all who were not able to do so, were flying from the city of palaces. Well, I remember that in 1876-77 there was
