Buffalo, Feb. 26.—After a year and a half, fighting to keep out of prison, following their conviction for grand larceny and bribery in the North Street Cemetery case, former County Auditor John W. This is the result of a unanimous decision of the Court of Appeals yesterday, affirming the findings of the lower courts.
