Ottawa, Aug. 2—Sir Edward Kemp, now Minister without portfollo, and formerly Minister of the Overseas Forces, of Canada, has written the Finance Department returning un-cashed all cheques received by him for ministerial salary during the war period. In all the cheques amount to \$5249 covering the whole of the payments to him as Minister of Militia and later as Minister of Overséas Forces. Previous to being swo.m in as Minister of Militia and subsequently as Minister of seas Forces Sir Edward was with out portfolio and acted, without re muneration as chairman of the War Perchasing Commission. In this cap acity, and as Min'ster, he had recessity to incor expenses recessity to incor expenses from time to time and was entitled to be re-imburred by the Government, but he had re-idered no account for such outlays, nor will be do so. He has also refrained from drawing any of his sesonal indemity for the last f.ur sessions of parliament. S'r Henry Drayton, Minister of Finance, has appropriately a ledged Sir Edward's generosity or behalf of the Government.
