

Interesting Items.

A young female Quaker, accompanied by three others of her persuasion, is now making a tour of England with the view of converting by public exhortation, the view and immortality of the present day. She is reported to possess a good property, and to be wholly possessed by a desire to promote public happiness.

Stephens, the "Herd Centre" of the Irish Fenians, who was committed for trial a few weeks ago, escaped from goal on the 24th ult. Bather a fine commentary on the efficiency of the police authorities.

On Sunday morning a fire broke out near of J. R. Cook's grocery store, King Street, St. Catharines, which was destroyed, together with Kane & Murray's bakery, and one small building, occupying a barbers' shop and saloon. Loss about \$4,000; insured for \$1,600.

The state of Michigan has 1073 saw-mills and 894 of them producing during the past year 621,483,000 feet of sawed lumber. Allowing for mills that made no return the entire production of the state amounted probably to 800,000,000 feet.

SEIZURE OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION AT THE SCREVENSON BRIDGE. A quantity of revolvers and cartridges were seized by the Custom House Officers, at the suspension bridge, early on Saturday morning.

We regret to announce the death of William Moorman, of the 2nd Concession of Thurston, which occurred last week from hydrophobia. His feet had been lacerated (by a favorite dog, which was afterwards discovered to be rabid. The unfortunate man died in hospital.

Thomas Halkew, an employee of the Tecumseh Hotel, London, who about a month since was wounded in the leg by a pistol shot, and who was afterwards found having unfortunately expired.

Of all the places in the world a penitentiary would seem the most unlikely to be broken into by burglars. Yet on Wednesday night, last week, the Provincial Penitentiary at St. John was broken into by robbers, who stole a gold watch and chain valued at \$125 from the apartments of one of the keepers. No clue to the thieves has been yet discovered.—(Nova Scotia paper.)

The Kerby house, in Brantford, the most and most commodious hotel in Upper Canada at the time it was burned in 1854, has been completely dismantled, and all the furniture sold by the sheriff, and the creditors now litigating about the division of the spoils. It will probably never again be opened as an hotel. Its principal rooms are now let out to a number of families, as that it has now assumed the name of the "Boe live" in lieu of the "Kerby House."

During one of the last battles in Mexico, a French officer was wounded severely in the thigh, and for four days several surgeons were engaged attempting to discover the ball. Their soundings gave him excruciating pain. On the fifth day he could bear it no longer, and called to the surgeons, "Gentlemen, in Heaven's name, what are you about?" "We are looking for the ball," "Mon Dieu! why do you go any farther? It is in my waistcoat pocket!"

At a provincial Law Society's dinner, the President called upon a lawyer attorney to give as a toast the name of the profession. "Certainly," was the response. "The man who makes his own name."

NEW STERILIZING DRESS.—The Commissioner of Customs is convinced from the character of the reports which he is daily receiving from the Canadian frontier, that his action in employing French detectives there was judicious, and will be of great benefit in the exposure and arrests of the female smugglers, who have recently been so extensively engaged with contraband trade between Canada and the United States. Another smuggling dodge has just been detected. An unusual number of coffins have been brought across the line of latitude, for importation on the American side. Last week the United States Revenue Officer insisted upon examining the corpse after the coffin was landed, against the earnest protests of the stricken relatives, when instead of a dead body, the coffin was filled with costly silks!
