A large attendance greeted the speakers at the debate on Thursday evening, the subject being very interesting and important, viz.—
"Resolved, that the Municipal Council are doing the best they can with the limited means a their disposal."
The affirmative was led by Mr. Alex. Mews and seconded by Mr. W. Drover and Mr. R. Holloway; the main contention being that the Council represented public opinion and that when the citizens demanded improvements and a more afficient sorprovements and a more efficient service they would get it; that full pow-

ers of incorporation were needed to make the Council independent of the Government; that owing to various reasons it was impossible to collect arrears of water rates, etc.

The negative was led by Dr. Macpherson, seconded by Mr. H. Wyatt and Dr. Roberts. It was advocated that the police could be used more than at present to enforce the Council's laws without extra cost to the Council; that infant mortally would be reduced if the law against the throwing of refuse and night soil on the streets was enforced; that insurance rates would be reduced if a more competent inspection of chimneys was obtained and citizens be members contending that the Council ignored public opinion and did not apply the same principles to the Council as they did to their own business, and until that was done we could not expect much improvement, as no Councillor would accept for his own business labor which he now accepts for the city. On the vote being taken it was decided in the negative by a year large majority.
