

ALONG THE RAILWAY LINES.

The Dudley Dynograph Car-A Marvel-ous Piece of Mechanism,

ous Piece of Mechanism.

New York Times: The Dudley dynograph car is about to start on its annual summer inspection tour over several of the eastern railroads. The car is the property of P. H. Dudley, and on this trip will start out with many added improvements. For months Mr. Dudley has been working hard to overcome all obstacles which have confronted him on former trips, and this time he says he has the mechanism of the car in almost perfect order. Everything has been so arranged in the car by the owner and inventor that the exact conditions of the rails and roadbed, the motion of the car, speed, etc., will new be registered on a long roll of paper asthe car passes over the rails. The car is now at the Grand Central Station, and yesterday Mr. Dudley thoroughly explained its workings to a reporter for the Tribune. The car was built expressively for Mr. Dudley, and it is the home of the inventor and his wife as well as his workshop.

The car is 40 feet long, and the instrument which records the defectain the rails, roadbed and the other things is situated in one end of the car. The instrument is worked by electricity and by the movement of the whoels of the car. The records are made with a system of littleglass tubes filled with red ink, and tapering to fine, pen-like points, which will trace on paper, as the car moves along at any rate of speed, anything that is desirable to know about the condition of the rails and roadbed. The paper used is about 24 inches wide, and it passes from one roller to another, both the rollers moving in connection with the wheels of the car. A strip of this paper eight feet long is used to each mile traversed, and the is used to each mile traversed, and the points of the little glass tubes mark on the paper the alignment of each rail, the de-gree of curvature as well as the elevation of gree of curvature as well as the elevation of each cure, the speed at which the car is moving, and the condition of the surface of the rails. Every variation of one thirty-second of an inch an over is recorded. In connection with the registering and tracing instrument in the car is a contrivance which automatically ejects a drop of blue paint unon each joint in the track where the end of one rail is one-sixteenth of an inch or more out of gar.

The dynograph car goes over the different systems behind a special engine, but does not travel faster than twenty miles an hour. Better results are obtained, Mr. Dudley says, when the car does not move at a greater speed. Along the route traversed by the car printed slips of paper explaining the meaning of the blue marks on the rails are handed to the foreman of the section gangs, and they immediately start out to repair the defects. This summer Mr. Dudley will go with his car over the Lake Shore Road, the New York Central, the Boston and Albany, the Old

the Lake Shore Road, the New York Central, the Boston and Albany, the Old Colony, the New York and New England, and several other roads.

Mr. Dudley will live aboard the car during his trip. He has fitted up comfortable quarters, and his wife will go with him. In the car are a well-equipped kitchen, library and a sitting-room, in which Mrs. Dudley has her plane.

The total number of railway employes on The total number of railway employes on June 30, 1890, was 749,301. The number killed during the twelve months preceding was 2,451 and the number injured 22,396. This means one death for every 306 and one injury for every 30 men employed. Confining the statement to those employes engaged directly in the handling of trains, that is to say, engineers, firemen, conductors and other trainmen, the results are beyond the experience in any other busiductors and other trainmen, the results are beyond the experience in any other business or trade. The number of employes of this class was 153,235, and out of this number there occurred during the year 1,459 deaths and 13,172 injuries due to some form of railway accident. This means one death for every 105 and one injury for every 12 men engaged in handling trains. In no other employment, not even in mining, which is a most dangerous occupation, can such results be shown. The total number killed in coupling and uncoupling cars was 369 and the number injured was 7,842; while the total number killed in falling from trains and engines was 561 and the total number injured was 2,363. That is to say, 37,94 per cent, of the total number of deaths and 45.57 per cent, of the total number of injuries sustained by railway employes resulted while tained by railway employes resulted while coupling cars or setting brakes.—[Forum.
