THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

TODAY

(From The London Advertiser of Feb. 12, 1871.)

Rev. G. M. Innes will deliver a lecture before the Church of England Y. M. A. in Bishop Cronin Hall next Monday evening; the subject, "The Life of Peter the Great."

A rink of the London Club, with Col. Moffatt as skip, played a game with the Strathroy curlers last Wednesday, defeating them by 4 shots. The Thames Club of this city will play for the Calcutta medal with the Chatham Club on the ice here next Monday.

The London railway deputation, after their triumphant tour through Huron and Bruce, returned home today. The trip was enjoyed immensely by the whole party, and all unite in praise of the country and the people up north. A meeting of the board of trade will be held on Monday afternoon, at the usual hour and place, to receive the report of the deputation.

The debate in the rooms of the London Literary Society last evening was largely attended, many ladies being among the audience. The subject of debate was that, in the event of a separation of the colonies from Great Britain, "Resolved, that an independent form of government would be preferable to annexation." The affirmative was supported by Messrs. Gibbons and Meek, and the negative by Messrs. Land and Knowlton. By a vote of the meeting the question was decided in favor of the affirmative.

Messrs. McNab, Gibson and Howard, law students of this city, passed creditable examinations before the Benchers in Toronto this week.

The London railway deputation held a meeting in the town hall, Kincardine, on Wednesday, the 8th inst. R. Baird, Esq., reeve of Kincardine, occupied the chair.

"The only thing you can make men out of is the little boys. The biggest job God ever gave to men and women is to make men out of your little boys, and grand women out of your little girls. When you have done that, you have done the best work that mortal can do."

"When the world's history shall be made up, the richest chapters in it will not be along the lines of our development commercially, agriculturally or financially. One true, splendid, real man will give more history and character to Canada than all the products of our country will give for a hundred years."

"Mothers, do you ever take your little boy and say you will make a man of him, even if his father is a scrub? A boy has not got to have the advantage of a great father to make a great man. He must have another."

No Patience With Speculation.

"I have no patience with your speculation in the financial world. The man who speculates is unreliable. There is not a solid bank in America that will give credit to a man who is a speculator. No church has any respect for the preacher who speculates with theology."

"If you have no faith in the future of this country of advanced criticism, have me down where they think I will have to part with the Bible or the other preachers? Well, the preachers can go to the devil for I am going to hang on to the Bible. There is this about the Bible, that if it does not make some preachers, it will not get much."

"I never hear a scientist sporting around but I want to spit on him and drown him—and if you find one that cannot swim you have got him."

"The great trouble today in the world is just what the devil would the professionals—little teachers, little lawyers, little preachers, little doctors. Why, they come out of seminaries and universities just like round sausages out of a machine. They are all the same size. The premium on pure honesty, industrious, upright manhood was never so high in the world's history as it is today. We have lawyers, doctors, teachers, merchants—anything you want except men. We have men short of men."

"The man who is a bigger than a king or a president. He is the biggest thing in God's universe, except God, who made him."

Doesn't Like Politicians.

"Whatever we hold dear today has come to us as a heritage from the men who stood up for right. We don't owe anything to politicians. Take the politicians of Ontario—if they all died to-night and trooped down to the gates of hell, the devil would sweep through the keyhole, and when he saw who they were he would shut up shop. I have no respect for, or confidence in, politicians. A dangerous citizen in Canada is the demagogue and politician."

"What we want today is an embodiment of manhood and moral stamina. The boy that will win is the boy that has courage to do right and has the sense to know that it is right."

"With all our advantages, we are not producing the men in the world today that our fathers and grandfathers produced. Just look at all the seminaries and sources of information! You would think that with them all, men should be as thick as the stars of heaven, yet you can only find one here and there. Those old-fashioned schoolhouses turned out more men than do the modern schoolhouses."

"Then there is the good old-fashioned religion. There is not much of it in Canada today. You have churches enough in Canada to serve the whole world, and I see something to the effect that they are going to unite. But I tell you, you will have to improve wonderfully or you will not drive the devil out of Canada with the gang you have now."

"Eight-Cent" Christians.

At this stage of the address Sam Jones took a rap at the saloon—or, more particularly, at the people who tolerate the existence of the saloon. Being informed by a person in the audience that London was the model city of Canada, he calculated from figures furnished him that the saloon business here netted the city \$4,000 a year,

had been troubled with what he supposed was only a severe cold, but in spite of good care and medical treatment he could not shake off his disease, which proved to be pneumonia, and after a week's suffering death came. His relief, Mr. Lilliman, who was a member of the Anglican denomination, was a man of sterling integrity, and quite recently in Rochester, N. Y. The funeral arrangements will be announced later.

NOT MUCH GOOD OLD-FASHIONED RELIGION IN THE COUNTRY TODAY

Sam Jones Scores "London's Eight-Cent Christians"—Doesn't Like Politicians.

Sam Jones, the Georgia evangelist, was in the city over Sunday, having come in connection with the twenty-eighth anniversary of the Y. M. C. A. He spoke three times. On Saturday evening he was at the Auditorium, and discussed morals and money. At twenty-five and fifteen cents a head the place was filled. Yesterday morning he was at the Dundas Street Methodist Church, and in the afternoon he held forth at the Opera House, where fifteen hundred persons heard the unique character.

Morals and Money.

Mr. Jones talked for over an hour at the Auditorium on Saturday night on "Morals and Money." Here are a few of his sayings.

"One mistake the world has made is that it has put gold before God. We think more of gold than God, more of chattels than character, more of mammon than of man."

"Really, we have run short of men, and every married woman in town thinks she has got a great man for a husband, whereas she has not got a man at all—just a pair of old breeches waddling around."
