BOY BATHERS BY THE HUNDRED

Playgrounds Committee Abandon the Idea of Pond in the North End.

The Playgrounds Association held its regular meeting Wednesday, at 4:30, in the city hall.

The matter of the baths for the children is proving very satisfactory, and the number availing themselves of the privilege is a cause for gratitude. Wednesday morning over 700 boys handed in tickets of admission.

It was decided to still continue the tickets for boys and girls, and to try to make provision for the children in the extreme ends of the city who may not visit the playgrounds and find it hard to obtain tickets. They hope soon to put tickets with responsible people in the other parts of the city to whom children may apply.

The difficulty confronting the committee is that grown people are taking advantage of what was only intended for children, and as Mr. Ye's offer was for children only, he does not feel that it is fair to him to admit adults, so the committee decided to place an age limit, and so all under 16 years will be allowed the use of the baths. Of course this does not hinder any mother coming with her children as a chaperon, although there will be members of the committee in attendance every Friday and the girls will be perfectly safe, as the water is quite shallow at one end.

It was also decided to limit the time for girls to half an hour in the water because it was felt at first that longer than that their health would be endangered.

HIGH COURT COSTS MUCH TOO HIGH

Mercantile Associations Will Seek Reform in This Matter.

Toronto, July 30.—The retail grocers and other mercantile associations will make another appeal to the Ontario Government at the coming session of the Legislature for some legislation that will protect them against the extortionate charges of the division courts in the collection of small accounts.

Last session a deputation of about 600 division court clerks put a damper on the appeal of the merchants, and advanced the contention that they would be deprived of a very large part of their income if what the grocers asked were granted.

The matter was left over and it is understood that Hon. J. J. Foy has some scheme in progress that will do away with the fee system, and pay the division court officials salaries.
