But Staffs Are Employed Clearing Up After Flood.

Ald. F. R. Watkinson, who is acting mayor today, and incidentally was one of the many local victims of the deluge Sunday, blames the inadequate sewers of the city, and, indirectly, the citizens themselves, for much of the damage incurred throughout the city.

"We have been struggling for years to get a proper sewerage system," he declared to The Advertiser today, thut the people hove voted it down to get a proper sewerage system." he declared to The Advertiser today, but the people hove voted it down every time. We will try it again at the next election. It was not only the ratepayers of East London who were hard nit, but those of West London also." "The people have got it into their heads that we must have pavements, forgetting all about sewers. We have go to have a proper sewerage system before more pavements are laid. The water will soak through a gravel road if there is a sewer underneath, but not so with a pavement. I lost everything in my cellar Sunday. The flood from London Township came right into the buildings on Dundas street east."

Sewers Backed Up.

Regarding damages incurred by the McCormick Manufacturing Company on Sunday, Donald C. McNaughton, vicepresident, said to The Advertiser this afternoon: "Our damages are about the same as others out here, amounting to about \$2,000 in our basement. We would have had no trouble at all if the sewer had acted. The water backed up into our stock. We are not running today because our motors are wet, and we cannot do anything until they dry."


