PARKS RESIDENTS PROTEST ACTIONS OF CERTAIN PARTY

County Constable Promises to Take Matter to Proper Authorities.

PREPARE FOR HOLIDAY

High County Constable Wharton was present at the regular meeting of the Progressive Ratepayers' Association of Highland and Manor Park held in the school last night, in connection with complaints received from residents concerning the actions of an undesirable resident of the park, and advised the meeting on the procedure to follow in case of a recurrence of the actions complained of. He also offered to take the matter up with the crown attorney in the interests of the people to ascertain just what could be done in the matter.

The rural hydro scheme soon to be introduced into the district came in for much unfavorable comment, due to the high rates to be levied on the consumers of the district, and the meeting went on record as being absolutely opposed to the imposition of the service charge as proposed, and were unanimous in their declaration that with the introduction of the rural hydro rates, the consumers would certainly refuse to pay them, as it is felt that the service charge of \$3.00 per month irrespective of amount of hydro consumed, is beyond reason.

Drastic Action.

This action on the part of the residents is drastic, and will mean that the district will be without hydro power. But as the City Gas Company is willing to proceed with the laying of the gas mains into the parks, it is felt that the cheapness and convenience of the gas will more than recompense the former consumers of hydro who have at present many electric appliances. The chairman of the Hydro Power Commission has been communicated with by the association, in an effort to have the situation remedied, but his answer to one letter after his apparent apathy to following communications, has convinced the residents of the district that no alleviation of the situation can be hoped for. Nevertheless, the association is backed up in its stand by practically every resident, in view of the fact that articles appear from time to time in the Ontario press, to the effect that cuts are being put in the price of hydro power, and then again that a huge surplus of power exists.

Prepare for Holiday.

Arrangements were practically completed for the 24th of May celebration, and if tentative plans are carried out, the celebration this year promises to eclipse all efforts of previous years.

The unveiling of the war memorial will take place on Sunday, the 27th of April, Brig.-Gen. King, G. O. C., M. L. No. 1, and Col. C. M. R. Graham have signified their willingness to take part in the ceremony, and the veterans of the city will be there in force.

Much other routine business was transacted, and the meeting did not adjourn till a late hour.

PRISONER REMANDED ON VAGRANCY CHARGE

Archie McKinnon Will Be Given Medical Examination Before Appearing Again.

Archie McKinnon, charged with vagrancy, was remanded to jail for a week by Magistrate Graydon in police court today. McKinnon said he came from Newbury, and had been confined to an institution there.

Questioned by the court, the accused stated he had relatives at the Soo, and that he had heard his mother was still living. McKinnon also volunteered that he had been confined to an institution in the United States. He will be given a thorough medical examination before he next appears in court.
