MRS. L. R. THOMAS DEAD

(Bad Axe, Mich., Tribune)

On Wednesday, Feb. 16, about four o'clock p.m., at the residence in Bad Axe, Mrs. Leonard R. Thomas quietly closed her eyes to enter into her eternal rest.

Agnes A. James was born Nov. 7, 1850, at Warwick, Ont. There she spent her girlhood and there, Feb. 8, 1871, she was united in marriage with Leonard R. Thomas. Mr. and Mrs. Thomas continued to live in Warwick, where they had many friends for over seven years, coming to Huron county, Michigan, in 1878, where they settled on a farm in Meade township. After about 21 years the family came to live in Bad Axe, where they have made their home since 1899. Six children, three boys and three girls, were born to them and remain with Mr. Thomas to mourn the loss of a devoted wife and mother. The children are: Mrs. John Logan, of Meade; Charles R. of Pinnebog; Mrs. Alex. Graham, of Bad Axe; Archie L., of Harbor Beach; William R., of Port Huron; and Mrs. F. L. Wright, of Bad Axe. Four brothers, William and Robert, Warwick, Dr. Thomas and Dr. Samuel; San Francisco, and three sisters, Mrs. Giffin, London, Mrs. Ellis, Toronto, and Mrs. W. G. Hall, War-Wick, also survive her.

On February 8th they quietly observed their golden wedding anniversary, on which occasion they were handsomely remembered by the family and friends. Mrs. Thomas was too ill, however, to permit of any elaborate celebration.

Mrs. Thomas was a most earnest and active member of the Presbyterian church and during her residence in Bad Axe until illness came was an unweary worker, especially in calling upon all who needed her friendship and assistance. She was a devoted home-loving wife and a mother who did not spare herself in ministering to her children.

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas are well known in Huron county, Mr. Thomas having served long as supervisor and having represented Huron county in the state legislature. They have many friends and Mrs. Thomas leaves behind her a host who have known and appreciated her as a woman, a neighbor, a friend and a gracious worker in the vineyard of her Master.

The funeral was held from the Presbyterian church, of Bad Axe, and was conducted by her pastor, the Rev. Robert Brown. Deceased was laid to rest in beautiful Colfax cemetery.

NEW DAIRY MEASURES TAKE EFFECT IN 1922

On the second reading of the Bill to Amend the Dairy Standards Act in the Legislature Monday, Hon. Manning Doderly, Minister of Agriculture, announced that the measure would come into force on January 1, 1922. During the interval before that date, the Minister stated, inspectors and instructors operating under the Dairy Branch would get in touch with all creamery employees and cheese-makers in the Province, with a view to having complete machinery prepared for the working out of the act at the new year, especially in the matter of the making of the Babcock test.

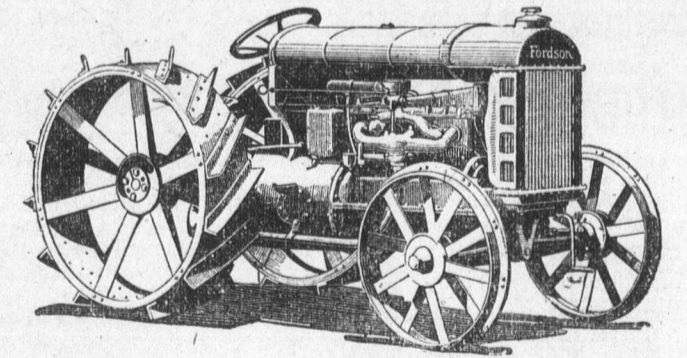

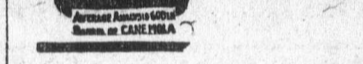
