KING—The earliest red variety, fruit bright crimson and best of quality, very productive, a vigorous grower and a very hardy variety. It rules the berry world in red varieties.

RUBY RED—Fruit large, bright red in color and very firm. It ripens with the earliest and continues picking a long season. A strong grower of large, hardy canes. An excellent berry to grow for profit.
