The beautiful engraving of Partridge Cochins shown on this page represents a pair now owned by Mr. P. J. Keller, of Buffalo, N. Y. Mr. Keller exhibited them at the Western Fair, London, last month, winning 2nd; also 2nd and 3rd on chicks. The hen in the above cut was 2nd in breeding pen at New York City, January 1884, scoring 92½ points. We saw these birds at London, and think Mr. Keller has fine stock, large, of splendid color, and well pencilled, showing great care and good judgement in breeding. He purchased the 1st prize pullet at this show, and is determined to keep his stock in the front rank.
