The yield per acre of syrup is from 140 to 280 gallons, and the produce of sugar is about 6 lbs. to the gallon of syrup. My seed has been specially selected for purity.

Says the St. Paul Pioneer: Mr. Miller actually raised 900. pounds of excellent cooking sugar from each acre of ground.

Besides this there is left some five or six pounds of syrup from each gallon. All that we have seen is thick with sugar, and sells for 90 cents per gallon. The cultivation required is the same as for corn.
