THE ROYAL MILITARY COLLEGE.

THERE are few national institutions of more value and
interest to the country than the Royal Military Col-
lege at Kingston. At the same time its objects and the
work it is accomplishing are not sufficiently understood
by the general public.

The College is a Government institution, designed
primarily for the purpose of giving the highest technical
instructions in all branches of military science to cadets
and officers of Canadian Militia. In fact, it is intended
to take the place in Canada of the English Woolwich and
Sandhurst and the American West Point.

The Commandant and military instructors are all offi-
cers on the active list of the Imperial army, lent for the
purpose, and in addition there is a complete staff of pro-
fessors for the civil subjects, which form such a vast por-
tion of the College course.

Whilst the College is organized on a strictly military
basis, the cadets receive in addition to their military
studies a thoroughly practical, scientific and sound train-
ing in all subjects that are essential to a high and gen-
eral education.

The course in mathematics is very complete, and a
thorough grounding is given in the subjects of Civil
Engineering, Civil and Hydrographic Surveying, Physics,
Chemistry, French and English.

The object of the College course is thus to give the
cadets a training which shall thoroughly equip them for
either a military or civil career.

The strict discipline maintained at the College is one
of the most valuable features of the system. As a result
of it young men acquire habits of obedience and self-
control, and consequently of self-reliance and command,
as well as experience in controlling and handling their
fellows.

In addition to constant practice of gymnastics, drills
and outdoor exercises of all kinds insure good health and
fine physical condition.

An experienced medical officer is in attendance at the
College daily.

Seven commissions in the Imperial regular army are
annually awarded as prizes to the cadets.

The length of course is three years, in three terms or
9½ months residence each.

The total cost of the three years' course, including
board, uniforms, instructional material, and all extras, is
from \$750 to \$800.

The annual competitive examination for admission to
the College will take place at the headquarters of the
several military districts in which candidates reside, May
of each year.
