

Question No. 590, by Mr. Roxburgh,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. How many facilities for sport alone have been built by the government Winter Works Programme during the years of 1961-1962, and how much money has been spent on such facilities?

2. How many such facilities are to be built during 1963 by the government Winter Works Programme, and what amount of money, if any, has been allocated for them?

Question No. 594, by Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale),—Order of the House for a Return showing: Has Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation carried on negotiations from time to time with any person or persons with respect to the advancing, by way of loan, of funds for the construction of buildings, including rental housing projects, within that area in the City of Toronto bounded on the North by Howard Street, on the West by Ontario Street, on the South by Wellesley Street East, and on the East by Parliament Street and, if so, (a) with whom were such negotiations carried on (b) what persons were applying as borrowers, specifying in the case of individuals, their names and addresses, and in the case of a corporation or corporations, its or their corporate name, the address of its or each of their principal place of business, the jurisdiction under which incorporated, and the names and addresses of all directors and officers (c) what was the outcome of such negotiations and if any loan agreement was entered into when will (i) clearing of the land, and (ii) construction of the buildings commence, and upon what events will the principal of the loan be advanced and (d) if any loan agreement was entered into but is no longer in force, why was it terminated?

Question No. 603, by Mr. Davis,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. What was the total capital cost of the Second Narrows Bridge in Vancouver, British Columbia, and what proportion of this cost was met by the Federal Treasury?

2. What formula was used in order to determine the federal share of this expenditure?

The Order for the House to resolve itself into Committee of Supply being read for the first time, pursuant to Standing Order 56(2);

"and replaced with a policy of debt-free money and constructive proposals to foster balanced domestic economy and balanced international trade."

And debate continuing; the said debate was interrupted.
