Parliament or in pursuance of any resolution or standing order of this House may be deposited with the Clerk of the House on any sitting day, and such return, report or other paper shall be deemed for all purposes to have been presented to or laid before the House.

Recorded in Votes and Proceedings.

(2) A record of any such return, report or other paper so deposited shall be entered in the *Votes and Proceedings* of the same day.

CHAPTER VI

NOTICES

Notice required for motion. 41. Forty-eight hours' notice shall be given of a motion for leave to present a bill, resolution or address, for the appointment of any committee, or for placing a question on the order paper; but this rule shall not apply to bills after their introduction, or to private bills, or to the times of meeting or adjournment of the House. Such notice shall be laid on the Table before six o'clock p.m., and be printed in the Votes and Proceedings of that day.
