MORE "PIONEER FOOT-PRINTS."

After the paper about "Foot-prints of the Presbyterian Pioneers" was printed, the writer learned, by a letter from Rev. S. Fenton, of Vittoria, that Rev. Jaboz Collver. a Presbyterian Minister who "was ordained in the United States in the year George III. was crowned," settled in Norfolk County in 1793, antedating the arrive in Canada of Mr. McDowall by five years, and the coming of Mr. Eastman by eight years.
