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

DOWN CAME RAIN AND ALSO WHEAT

But Later Reports Cheered Bulls and Net Gain Was

Scored.

CHICAGO, June 3.—Alleged insuf-lelency of Kansas rains helped bring bout a rally today in wheat. Closing prices were firm at an advance of a shade to 3-8c net. Corn finished 7-8c to 11-4c up, oats with a gain of 1-8c to 1-2c and provisions off 17 1-2c te

Notwithstanding that downpours were general in the dry sections of Kansas, the moisture failed to check reports of wheat damage from hot winds and premature ripening. At first, however, the rains formed a bearish influence too great to be withstood and the market lurched heavily downward. Then came opinions that the injury by the extreme heat of the last days of May had not been overcome by the rains.
