Misrepresentation Alleged.

Besides Inspector Reynolds, Inspectors Wilcox of Niagara Falls, Clydesdale of Windsor and Bell of Sarnia, officers at ports of entry where the men entered Canada, were the crown's chief witnesses. All gave testimony that the accused entered Canada by misrepresentation when they told the officers that they were merely coming to Canada on a visit.

After hearing lengthy arguments of counsel, Magistrate Ball reserved decision until Thursday, June 19.


