

“ ment, (which, though in some respects  
 “ limited, is, in its essence and principle;  
 “ monarchical,) or will be greatly altered  
 “ by the wisdom of the British legisla-  
 “ ture, and rendered more dependant on  
 “ the crown, as the charter of that other,  
 “ and most turbulent, province of *New-*  
 “ *England*, the Massachusets Bay, (though  
 “ less democratical than the two former,)  
 “ was in the year 1774 by the advice of  
 “ those eminent statesmen, Lord North  
 “ and Lord George Germaine.\*

“ In the second place the proprietary  
 “ governments of Pennsylvania and Mary-  
 “ land will most probably be also corrected  
 “ by the same wise and supreme legisla-  
 “ ture; and the powers of government  
 “ which are vested by the charters of those  
 “ colonies in the heirs of William Penn
