He had found himself in many a tight place; he had been confronted with formidable difficulties; for over seventy years he had been thrown upon his own resources; he had found himself the centre of many an exciting conflict; he had had grave responsibilities thrust upon him; he had succeeded wonderfully and had established himself in the esteem and respect of all classes in the Empire; he had carried to a successful completion enormous enterprises and had come to be reckoned one of the great men of the time. words of such a man are weighty. His counsels should compel attention. These maxims of his may well be pondered for he hammered them out on the anvil of his own experience.
