He has sought for the privilege of constructing a railroad in Tennessee, and his preliminary plans meet with favor the work will be launched next month. The City Council of Nashville will receive a formal proposition from the Social Democracy to build a seventy-five mile road from Nashville to Lebanon, which will be turned over to the State for a nominal consideration. Labor for the building and operating of the railroad will be furnished by the Social Democracy, and it is intended that the work be maintained under the methods set forth by the advocates of public ownership of railroads.

It was presented to a convention by Mrs. Mary Bannister Willard, at the International Temperance Congress at Antwerp, Belgium, Sept. 12, 1885. It was presented to the first public meeting in Washington, D.C., February, 1886, where it decorated the great Convention Hall, which held 7000 people. Miss Willard and the general officers of the World's and National W.C.T.U. were granted an interview with President Cleveland, when Miss Willard spoke and Mrs. Clara Hoffman read the document. The Queen of England has been presented with a photographic copy of the petition, beautifully bound and calligraphed. This petition asks the Governments of the world to raise the standard of the law to that of Christian morals by the total prohibition of the drink traffic and the opium trade. It contains 1,500,000 signatures, mounted on canvases four columns abreast, the size of which is nearly two miles. The choir for the Massena Hall meeting will meet for the first rehearsal to-morrow evening. All the city choirs have been invited to join the chorus, which will be under the able direction of Mr. Crigian. Badges will be supplied the members of the choirs, which will admit them to the platform. Co-operation of the different choirs is very desirable, for the delegates will carry away from the platform the impression of Toronto, which is already known as a musical city.

Floods in China Wipe out Sixty Villages Near Peking, the Capital. Chicago, Oct. 5.—A press special from Tacoma, Wash., says: The steamer Victoria brings news of one of the most disastrous floods that have ever visited China. Sixty villages near Tung Choo, containing over 80,000 inhabitants, have been completely destroyed. The water drowned or forced to flee. There are no means of finding out how many thousands have been drowned. The number is estimated by Chinese authorities at from 15,000 to 20,000. The flooded districts lie about 100 miles from Peking, the capital of China.

TO BUILD A RAILROAD

Will Be the First Undertaking of the Social Democracy Led by Eugene V. Debs. Chicago, Oct. 5.—Railroad building has been selected by Eugene V. Debs as the first great industrial project to be undertaken by the Social Democracy of America. He has sought for the privilege of constructing a railroad in Tennessee, and his preliminary plans meet with favor the work will be launched next month. The City Council of Nashville will receive a formal proposition from the Social Democracy to build a seventy-five mile road from Nashville to Lebanon, which will be turned over to the State for a nominal consideration. Labor for the building and operating of the railroad will be furnished by the Social Democracy, and it is intended that the work be maintained under the methods set forth by the advocates of public ownership of railroads.
