Canadian Writes to New York Paper as to Guarding Against Strikes.

New York, Jan. 16.—The Sun prints the following letter: As the consequence of the coal strike, Canada is facing a scarcity of coal which, if this winter lasts, will cause suffering as well as loss. We look anxiously to the future of the mines.
