### WANT MINERAL **SURVEY TO PUT** CANADA AHEAD

Ontario. Boards of Trade Ask For It.

EMPLOY RETURNED MEN Also Want Provision for Soldiers to Settle in This

Immediately after the closing of the first convention of Western Ontario United Boards of Trade yesterday afternoon the directors appointed met for the purpose of electing officers for the coming year from their num-

problem of the reinstatement of soldiers in civil life, five resolutions submitted and unanimously indorsed having a direct bearing on this subject. No less than four of these were presented by F. Maclure Sclanders, commissioner of the Border Chamber of Commerce. One, termed by Mr. Dunn of Chatham, as probably the most important of the convention, proposed that the United Boards of Trade of Western Ontario respectfully suggest to the Dominion Government that serious consideration be given to the feasibility of making a comprehensive mineral survey of the country, thus affording employment at suitable remuneration to returned soldiers, and looking to provision for the development of the enormous mineral resources of Canada to help pay the war debt, etc.

Mr. Sclanders stated that to his knowledge, no real geological survey has been made of Canada, and that

"God has given us in Canada most tremendous mineral wealth," he said, "yet we depend largely for our raw materials upon the United States. Our country could supply the whole world with minerals for a million years to come, and we have sufficient for the empire for all time. What we want to do is to look after them and develop them.

Mineral Survey.

our country is incalculably rich in mineral resources, precious and commercial, and in great variety, which resources at present largely constitute merely a potential rather than an actual national asset; and "Whereas it is now economically expedient that such natural resources be speedily transformed to productivity; and

"Whereas it is obvious that the initial step in this desirable direction must be a clearer knowledge of the nature and location of such mineral wealth, which knowledge could be acquired only through the medium of a comprehensive scheme involving a thorough and practically conducted prospecting of all geologically likely areas; and

"Whereas it seems highly probable that many of our returned soldiers may not incline to revert to their former sedentary occupations, but would prefer a freer outdoor life, such as employment in connection with the above suggested prospecting survey;
"Therefore, be it resolved by this convetion of the United Boards of Trade of Western Ontario, that it be respectfully suggested to the Dominion Government that serious consideration be given to the feasibility of affording employment at suitable remuneration, to returned soldiers in the work of a thoroughly comprehensive mineral survey of this country; that such returned men be first equipped with a short theoretical course in mineralogy, and thereafter sent into the field under experienced prospectors, and divided into groups to each of which certain specified territory would be allotted; and, further, that some plan be devised whereby the discovery of every important mineral deposit would reflect to the pecuniary advantage, by bonus or otherwise as might be arranged, of its discoverer and of the prospector in charge of his group."

Settlement on Land.

The second resolution, dealing with the question of settlement of soldiers on the land and financial assistance available for them from the Government, was prompted by the fact that under the soldiers' settlement act of 1917 the Dominion Government can only make loans on first mortage security to the


