Grand Duke Cyril escaped from Russia in the summer of 1917 with a whole eight-car train filled with Russian gold. He reached Berlin via Stockholm through the connivance of Kerensky and German officials after the Brest-Litovsk peace. Now Cyril, who is a cousin of the former czar, realizes that the Bolshevists must be overthrown, and through a secret agreement with the German Government, he is providing funds for von der Goltz to make an offensive against Petrograd.

It is believed von der Goltz will capture the Russian capital before Gen. Yudenich can reach Petrograd, after which von der Goltz will strike southward toward Moscow.

BABY 'BILLY' DANCEY IS SOUGHT IN VAIN

Forty Volunteers Search Woods, Cranberry Bogs and Fields Without Finding Him.

Hammonton, N. J., Oct. 16.—Though forty volunteers today continued the neighborhood search for "Billy Dancey." the 30-months-old baby who has been missing from his home six days, more reliance now is being placed in the activities of detectives who are looking further afield for the child. One of these has gone to Pittsburg, Mrs. Dancey's former home, in the hope of learning whether she had any enemy there who might have caused the child to be abducted. One clue was dissipated today when searchers visited a gypsy camp where, it was reported, a child resembling the Dancey boy was being held. Philadelphia's police have been notified of a woman seen to alight from a train there, and detectives are following up a letter from a woman alleging that she "knows where the child is." THE EYE ARTERIES

Nance a former president of the Chicago Ophthalmic Society, consulting and other institutions, yesterday declared he believed President Wilson had arterial hemorrhages. He told of the results of an examination of the president by a leading oculist, and his discovery of an arterial hemorrhage.

"Of course, only Mr. Wilson's physicians know what his condition is, and they have been unusually secretive about it," said Dr. Nance. "However, to judge by the published reports of the case and the actions of his physicians in compelling him to undergo a Examined Year Ago.

Examined Year Ago.

"A year or two ago he was examined by an oculist, and one of the first specialists called to Washington when Mr. Wilson returned from his speaking tour was an oculist, Dr. George de Schweinitz of Philadelphia, one of the most famous oculists in the country. I believe that Dr. de Schweinitz discovered an arterial hemorrhage of the retina, and that indicates the condition of the arterial walls throughout the human system.

"The retina is the only part of the body where the arteries can be observed. When an oculist examines with an ophthalmoscope the interior of the eye he can see those arteries. If there is a condition of hemorrhage there he immediately orders his patient to a complete rest, a model existence, plus a thorough physical examination, for if there are hemorrhages in the arteries of the eye there are likely to be other arterial troubles.

Arteries Grow Hard.

"It is common for oculists to be consulted because of headaches, dizziness.

To demonstrate by means of the ophthalmoscope the pathological changes in the retina, he gets the first signs of degeneration of the arterial system of the body. That is very probably what has happened in Mr. Wilson's case. The arteries, resilient in youth, become hardened as a man grows old, and hemorrhage may result.

"Hemorrhage of the arteries in the eye is not necessarily an indication of cerebral hemorrhage, but cerebral hemorrhage, derangement of the arterial system, and hemorrhages in the retina all go together. It does not necessarily mean that eye hemorrhages would be followed by brain hemorrhages, but such is likely.

"Judging from the whole handling of the case, it seems to me that Mr. Wilson's condition is serious. Cerebral hemorrhage means partial paralysis or death. The cure, if any, is complete rest, model habits, no hard work or strain."

Some of Mr. Wilson's recent photographs, taken in action, show him standing with his head thrown back at an unnatural angle. Dr. Nance was reminded of these.

"I had not noticed those photographs," said Dr. Nance, "but that position of the head would indicate in a way that the president has been bothered with an imperfection in his vision, caused by a hemorrhage of the arteries in the retina. I have seen patients with this complaint throw their heads back, saying they could get better vision in that manner. They were, to put is simply, 'looking around' a hemorrhage in the back of the eye, which, with vision thrown straight, caused a partial blindness."


