NEW MUTUEL MACHINES FOR CONNAUGHT PARK

Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 19.—At the annual
meeting of the Connaught Jockey Club
today, E. S. Houston, treasurer, reported
that the board of directors had declared
and had paid a dividend on the capital
stock of three per cent. for each of the
years in which no dividends were paid,
it was announced by the honorary treas-
urer that a substantial appropriation had
been made for the necessary improve-
ments at Connaught Park, and that the
jockey club proposed to invest approxi-
mately \$15,000 for a set of pari-mutuel
machines.

Senator Belcourt, president, presented
the shareholders with the new schedule
of racing regulations, and made it clear that
while Connaught Park had just closed a
very successful summer, it would be dif-
ficult under the revised statutes to re-
peat henceforth, it would be dif-
ficult under the new schedule of conditions
from the pari-mutuel machines, while
helpful to the largest part of the sum-
mers, would make it difficult for Con-
naught Park to carry on and to offer
the same liberal purses that were given
the horses this year.

Stewart McClenaghan, chairman of the
management committee, reported that
Connaught Park, during the past summer
had distributed \$50,000 in purses. At the
June meeting \$37,000 was given to the hor-
semen, and in the fall the total had to be
increased to \$40,000. Over \$12,000 of this
amount had been distributed among Canadian
owners, Connaught Park making a daily
feature of races for Canadian-bred horses.
