

SUPERANNUATION FUND COMMITTEE.

Feb. 10, 1864.—At a meeting of the Sub-Committee it was unanimously concluded that it would not be expedient at the present time to make an effort to raise a capital fund for this object, but that every means should be used to keep the object before the public.

The Committee requested the Bishop to recommend that an annual Sermon be preached in each parish, and a collection made in aid of the fund.

It was also resolved, "That those who in consequence of the appeal (lately put forth) had subscribed, with the understanding that the fund was to be raised without delay, should not be held accountable for the sums for which they had put down their names.

May 10, 1865.—At a meeting of the Committee an application was received in behalf of the Rev. J. Stewart, asking for a pension from the Fund on the ground that he is incapacitated at present for labor. The Committee granted a pension of \$100 per annum.

The Secretary submitted a statement showing that the annual increase of the Fund from invested money was \$228.

Note.—The above will show the actual necessity for a provision for those who are incapacitated for further labor, and also that the Committee are endeavoring, with the small amount at their disposal, to meet the want. The Committee earnestly appeal to their fellow Churchmen to give their help in establishing this Fund upon such a basis as will secure a pension of at least \$200 to those who are otherwise unprovided for.

MISSIONARIES.

The sum of \$2295 has been paid during 1864 for support of Missionaries.

A grant from this Society has enabled the Bishop to send the Rev. J. P. Sargent to Melford. His care has revived the attachment of the people to the Church of their fathers, and they are already preparing to build a residence for the Clergyman.

The vacancy at Bridgewater has also been filled up by the appointment of the Rev. W. E. Bullock to that Mission. He reports that his reception among the people gives much hope and encouragement.

The Mission at Digby Neck, formerly called Westport in the Society's Report, is now supplied with the Services of the Church

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
