The Training School for Nurses has continued in satisfactory operation throughout the year, as the following figures will show : 300 applications for information have been received ; 45 probationers have been accepted (36 of whom were continued in training), and 23 nurses have graduated during the year, making now a total of 42 graduates from this school.

Great credit is due to Miss Livingstone, the lady superintendent, for the successful conduct of the school and the efficient nursing of the patients by the nurses in training.
