Referring to my K-G-40 of the 22nd of June 1928, and your 30155-34 of the 8th of July both referring to the application of the Indians of the Tobacco Plains Reserve for permission to cut wind thrown trees for sale. I have just received further information upon the matter from Farm Instructor F. S. Ryckman of the Kootenay Agency, a copy of which I enclose. You will note that Mr. Letcher has promised to write the Agent giving his quotation within the next few days. I am instructing Mr. Ryckman to forward the quotations direct to you. You will also note that he asks whether the Department would be agreeable to sell a certain amount of standing lumber still remaining on the Reserve, especially the North east corner. I should recommend that the permission be granted to do this having in view the fact that the Indians lost out over the last lease with Mr. Nolan and that they are trying to clear up what remains.
