"New Brunswick will again pay her debts with spruce logs; it is quite evident that the money will not come from the products of the soil," was the way in which J. W. Corey, of Tobique, who is in the city today, summed up the general business situation on the upper St. John river as a result of the depression in the prices of agricultural products.

A larger number of small lumber operators than usual are preparing to enter the woods during the present season, said Mr. Corey, and a large cut is anticipated in the Tobique river districts. The increase in the number of small operators is due, he said, to necessity chiefly, and a large number will cut logs on the rear of their farm lots.

Labor is plentiful. Mr. Corey said, while the wages which are being generally offered to lumbermen on the Tobique are in the vicinity of \$35 per month.
