
Christiana, Jan. 17.—Norway's labor party has definitely split on the proposal to adhere to the third internationale of Moscow. Four hundred delegates to the party's congerss, in session here, have decided to oppose joining the internationale, and will found a new party to which most of the labor leaders in parliament will belong.

LOAN TO CHINA TO HELP STARVING

Peking, Jan. 17.—A loan of four million taels by British, French, United States and Japanese banks, to be applied to the relief of the famine stricken districts, has been concluded by the ministry of finance, with the approval of diplomats assigned to the Chinese republic. The loan will be secured by a customs surtax amounting to ten per cent. the date of the application of which has not ben fixed.
