

at a rate to be agreed upon at the time, or to be referred to the decision of the Medical Superintendent, on a reasonable trial.

SECTION V.

SECOND CLASS, NON-PAYING PATIENTS.

When such a Certificate of a Physician or Surgeon as aforesaid shall be produced, together with a Warrant under the hand of two Justices of the Peace nearest to the Patient, that such Patient is a Pauper upon the Parish of _____ in the County of _____, or if poor, but not a pauper, that such Patient has no property or means of support, and is a fit subject for admission into the Asylum as a non-paying Patient.

SECTION VI.

That every Patient shall be discharged whenever, in the opinion of the Medical Superintendent, he or she shall have been restored to a sound mind, notice of such intended discharge being previously given to the relations or parties acting in procuring the admission of the Patient.

SECTION I.

The person who procures the admission of a patient shall be admitted as a patient, and shall be liable to be discharged, except on a special order, that such patient, being in a dangerous and that his admission be forthwith reported to the Medical Superintendent, and sanctioned by him in a medical report.

Persons not belonging to the Province cannot, under any circumstances, be received for a less sum than £25 per Annum, payable quarterly in advance.

SECTION II.

That no female, in a state of pregnancy shall be knowingly admitted as a patient, except on clear proof that such a female being at large is dangerous, and that her admission be forthwith reported to the Lieutenant Governor, and sanctioned by him in a medical report; and should it be ascertained that any Patient admitted is pregnant, the Physician shall immediately notify the relations or parties procuring her admission of the fact, and she shall, without delay, be removed by them before confinement. And the relations shall be admitted with his inmate mother, except in cases where payment shall be required for the additional attendance and expenses thereby occasioned.

SECTION III.

That whenever an Inmate Pauper shall be sent to the Asylum by any Parish, the same shall be provided by such Parish, at the time of admission, with two full suits of decent and comfortable Clothing.

SECTION IV.

That Patients shall be admitted to the Asylum as follows:

FIRST CLASS, PAYING PATIENTS.

The person in charge of the Patient shall produce to the Medical Superintendent a Certificate from a qualified Physician or Surgeon, that the party is insane with all the particulars of the case, including age, occupation, the cause, character, and duration of the insanity, habits of life, and previous medical or other treatment, so far as the particulars are known to, or can be ascertained by, the certifying Physician, and shall furnish with the Patient, and during his continuance at the Asylum, a sufficient number of comfortable clothing, and shall give security to the satisfaction of the Committee for the payment of the part of the Patient and suitable attendances as required.
